Good morning. Yes, I can meet you at UCSD on the 15th. Will Mr. Bustamante be joining us? If not, I would prefer to come to you all in Oakland.

Regents Lancing and Perez specifically told me that Mr. Bustamante would address the problem of the misuse of the UC name, reputation, and other assets continuing to cause a fraud to grow so large that it is now causing a national security threat via crippling troop readiness via scientific fraud in the mold issue.

Mr. Perez said it was good that they were sending me to Mr. Bustamante because of his position in the UC Compliance and Audit Office.

The only reason that I called you after the 12/10 HSC meeting was so you wouldn't get blindsided when I contacted Mr. Bustamante. (It's not good to blindside people whose boss you are asking to help you!)

“MONTEREY, Calif. — Complaints about privatized military housing are mounting on the Monterey Peninsula. This comes after California U.S. Sen. Dianne Feinstein [and lying nonprosecuting Senator Harris] introduced a bill to ensure safer housing for military families.

At a recent Presidio of Monterey town hall meeting, many families said local privatized military housing is failing them and their health due to many infrastructure issues and mold they said has been detected.

In a statement following a hearing about privatized military issues in Washington, Feinstein raised an alarming statistic about how military families rank their privatized management.

Comments from residents during the town hall included, "We had mold in our bathroom.. mold in our windows," and, "We moved in, I got really sick. I didn't get better, my son got sick."

One resident questioned the management at The Parks, "How are you ensuring you are placing families in safe homes? And why are you not alerting residents of the possible risk."
